

Objectives


- Raise awareness about heatwave precautions and summer safety measures.

- The quiz covered topics such as hydration, heatstroke symptoms, and protective measures during extreme heat.







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

Take frequent breaks if you must work outdoors





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




Beat the Heat!

- Organize workshops on AI tools to further enhance students' technical skills for awareness campaigns.









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
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
